
# IAFNS Live Dietary Microbes Subcommittee


**The IAFNS LDM Subcommittee** aims to gather, develop, and drive science- and evidencebased decisions on dietary recommendations for live microbes.

• This framework was also endorsed by the American Society for Nutrition.




Live Microbes Attributes Added to the USDA Global **Branded Food Products Database in Food Data Central**, 2022

  - **Positive associations identified** for several health endpoints include immune health, gastrointestinal health, and weight.




# **Building the Evidence Base**

## **Analysis of Korean National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey, 2024**

• A stronger signal for an impact of live dietary microbe intake on health may be possible given fermented foods that are traditional components of the Korean diet (expected completion, 4Q 2024).
